Happy Easter!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:



On this Easter Sunday we hear St. John recount Mary Magdaline and other women who went to the tomb of Jesus "while it was still dark." Although they had left home in darkness and grief, by sunrise the women would witness with joy the resurrection of Jesus. The joy of His resurrection is something that cannot be contained and Mary Magdalene stands as an example.

Although her announcement of the resurrection of Christ comes at first as concern for the whereabouts of Jesus' body, this concern will be changed into an evangelizing spirit as she announces to the disciples "they have taken Him, and we do not know where he is."

The announcement by Mary to the disciples of the empty tomb causes a stirring confusion. The beloved disciple and Peter ran to the tomb. The beloved, moved by love, a love that kept him close to the cross of Christ at His crucifixion, a love that he experienced as he rested his head on the Savior's heart at the Last Supper, the beloved arrived at the tomb first: all too often love moves faster than human reason, in that regard, even faith is slower than love (*c.f.* 1Cor.13).

Yet, as the beloved did not enter the tomb first, he waited patiently for the one whose faith is solid as stone: Peter. Once Peter arrived, led by faith, the two disciples enter. Only to discover, like Mary, that Jesus was not there. Love felt that pain of separation, and faith was confounded, and it was in that empty tomb surrounded by the burial cloths of Jesus that faith and love in both Peter and the Beloved was stirred into belief. Belief that Jesus is the Messiah. And on this Easter Sunday, we, like Mary and the other disciples, proclaim that the tomb is empty. The Lord is Risen!

May our faith be deepened this Easter season and our Love for Jesus be enlivened with new vigor as the conqueror of sin and death takes His throne in glory.

Alleluia! Alleluia!
