"Never lose infinite hope"

Dr. Martin Luther King once said, "we must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope."

God is the author and giver of infinite hope as he draws us into a deeper relationship with Christ Jesus through prayer and the sacraments. This call invites us to cultivate a deeper trust in the guiding hand of God at work in our daily activities. Pope Francis reminds us of this in his announcement of the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025 saying,

"Everyone knows what it is to hope. In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring. Even so, uncertainty about the future may at times give rise to conflicting feelings, ranging from confident trust to apprehensiveness, from serenity to anxiety, from firm conviction to hesitation and doubt. Often we come across people who are discouraged, pessimistic and cynical about the future, as if nothing could possibly bring them happiness. For all of us, may the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope."

A scripture passage that we might sit with this week is found in the Old Testament prophet of Jeremiah (29:11) "For I know well the plans I have in mind for you, plans for your welfare and not for woe, so as to give you a future of hope."

May our prayers and actions this week strengthen our hope in Christ Jesus and the future that lay ahead.

Please join the Knights of Columbus next Sunday for breakfast. This month we will be serving pancakes, eggs, sausage, coffee and orange juice.








We will meet each **Tuesday at 5 pm starting February 11th** for reflection and fellowship in the Hospitality Room.

The study will conclude with consecration on March 4th.




