Disciple's Corner: Providing Dignity to Pueblo's Homeless

What does it mean to be a disciple of Christ? How does one live out the commission given at Confirmation to be a witness of Christ and bring others into relationship with Him? We are all called to be disciples of Jesus and to live out that call every day. The Second Vatican Council said that the laity are given this special vocation: "to make the Church present and operative in those places and circumstances where only through them can it become the salt of the earth" (Lumen Gentium 33).

In Disciple's Corner we will highlight parishioners who are living out their call to be disciples of Christ.



Two years ago, Isabel and Tom Starnes responded to an announcement in the parish bulletin asking for volunteers to cut hair for the Pueblo Cooperative Care Homeless Shower Program. Isabel enthusiastically offered her skills as a hairstylist. She and her team provide about 30 haircuts a week to the homeless in our community. Isabel's husband Tom provides support to the haircutting team by making sure they have what they need, keeping track of who is next in line for a haircut and providing a compassionate listening ear for the men and women who need to tell their story.

Tom and Isabel's deep faith, daily Mass attendance and adoration twice a week, along with their strong prayer life give them the courage and strength to help improve the lives of homeless men, women, and families. When asked: Do you ever feel afraid? Isabel responded, "If you believe in God, what is there to be afraid of?" Tom added, "Jesus says whatever you're doing for the least of these you are doing for me. If you're out there helping the homeless, you're doing His work—you're doing what He wants. What better way to spend your life than doing things Jesus asks you to do to begin with. It's very simple—do what you can."

In their volunteer work with the homeless, Tom and Isabel experience Jesus in the people they meet every week. "We have too much, they have nothing and are still praising God and keeping the faith—that can't be taken away" Isabel said. "Every person I talk to out there is like you're talking to Jesus—that's Jesus there, so be nice—that's Jesus you're talking to" Tom mentioned.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is the process for adults who desire to join the Catholic faith and for those seeking more information on the Catholic Church. OCIA can also be a method for Catholics to complete their reception of the initiation sacraments. The rite is designed for adults "who after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God.

Who is OCIA for?

Non-Catholics who want to find out more about the Catholic Faith Those who want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, or Profession of Faith

Those who were baptized Catholic as infants but never received religious education, Confirmation, or First Eucharist.

Diocesan Mission CO-OP




Next weekend we will welcome Fr. Bala from the Missionary Diocese of Nellore, India.
