

NATIVITY OF THE LORD DECEMBER 25, 2024

The shepherds went in haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. (Lk. 2:16)

Amid all the celebration and excitement of Christmas time, the image of the Nativity scene draws our attention to a particular joy. A joy the world proclaims at the coming of our Savior, a joy the angels announced as the word became flesh and dwelt among us, a joy Mary and Joseph experienced at the birth of their child. This joy is God's invitation to celebrate and lean into His abiding presence in our life.



I wonder what Joseph and Mary must have been feeling as they contemplated the great purpose God had set aside for them. One chosen to nurture and care for God's son and the other to protect, lead, and guide Him into adulthood. What a tremendous responsibility!

While that perspective on the role of Mary and Joseph in the life of Christ should give us cause to praise all mothers and fathers for their vocation, it should also invite us to pause in another way.

It can seem a little silly for us to become overly stressed about the hustle and bustle of our ordinary daily activities, all of which are important. But when the day to day start to become the only important thing, well, that's where Mary and Joseph come in.

Mary's faith allowed her to take and ponder things in her heart which helped her to recognize the miraculous hand of God at work in her midst. While Joseph's quiet presence and attention to God's voice allowed him to be docile to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Remember, God's spoke to Joseph in dreams.

On this Christmas, as God so graciously sent his Son, to share in our humanity; bringing us peace, hope, and love may we go through our life enlivened with the joy of not just knowing Jesus but seeing Him in our life and in our world throughout this season.

Joseph

December 27th-for the Feast of St. John the Apostle (his symbol is the eagle), here's a fun treat to make:

Here's what you'll need: Lollipop Sticks

Large Marshmallows Dark Chocolate Chips White Gumdrops

Almond Bark

Shredded Coconut Black Food Color Paste Flower Shaped Sprinkles



Here's what you do:

For the Body~

Put your large marshmallow on the stick and cover in melted dark chocolate. Stick on 2 yellow flower-shaped sprinkles for his feet, and chocolate chips for the wings. Allow to cool. Use a blob of melted almond bark to stick on shredded coconut for the eagle's tail.

For the Head~

Melt your dark chocolate and almond bark until smooth. Dip the bottom of your white gumdrop into the melted almond bark, then dip into your shredded coconut to make the "feathers" on his neck. Cut a slit where his beak goes, and insert a sideways yellow flower-shaped sprinkle. For the eyes, make 2 dots with black food color paste using a dull toothpick.
